Review information and provide comments about a proposed project to improve the intersection of Route 10 (Colonial Trail East) and Route 617 (Bacon's Castle Trail / White Marsh Road) in Surry County. The purpose of the project is to improve safety and traffic operations by building left turn lanes on Route 10 (Colonial Trail East) and a right turn lane on Route 617 (Bacon's Castle Trail). Improvements will also increase sight distance at the intersection for crossing traffic. The project is from 0.135 mile east to 0.277 mile west of the intersection, for a project length of 0.412 mile.

Citizens are invited to learn more by viewing the project website for the Route 10 and Route 617 Intersection Improvements project at www.virginiadot.org/route10-baconscastle and to submit comments using the linked online form. Public comments will be received from **October 28 through November 6, 2020**.

If there are concerns that cannot be satisfied through this on-line process, VDOT is willing to hold a public hearing. You may request a public hearing be held by sending a written request to Mr. Kenneth McKinna, Virginia Department of Transportation, 7511 Burbage Drive, Suffolk, VA 23435 on or prior to **November 11, 2020**. If a request for public hearing is received, notice of date, time and place of hearing or virtual opportunity will be posted.
